Grief Is A Shared Journey



Grief and bereavement support are essential elements of end-of-life care. As a society, we are so focused on prolonging life and curing illness that very little thought is given to what happens at the end of our journey – including what happens to those who are left behind.

National Bereavement Day, an annual day of awareness observed this year on November 17th, is an opportunity to bring this discussion to the forefront of Canadians' minds, and allow time to grieve, to remember, and to heal. The focus for this year's National Bereavement Day is that grief is a shared journey; one that fosters compassion and encourages individuals to cope with their grief by supporting each other,

through living and grieving. While we might be physically distanced, our grief brings us together.

This reality has created urgency for organizations, like Hospice Quinte, to ensure that grief and bereavement support and resources are readily available and easily accessible in the new state of the world. Hospice Quinte has seen a significant rise in the need for increasingly complicated grief and bereavement support during the pandemic. In order to continue to provide no-cost bereavement support at a safe distance to our community, Hospice Quinte created a Peer Telephone Bereavement Support program that is delivered by trained Hospice Quinte volunteers. The organization also received a \$40,000 grant from the Federal Government's 'Emergency Community Support Fund' enabling Hospice Quinte to create a Supportive Bereavement Counselling program as well.
